

THE STAGES AND STEPS INVOLVED IN THE TRUST'S STRATEGIC AND SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH GRANTS PROCESS

Discovery

The Trust has multiple resources to help your organization determine grant eligibility.

Submitting a Letter of Inquiry

A **Letter of Inquiry (LOI)** helps the Trust determine whether your organization and project are eligible and consistent with Trust practices. If so, you will be invited to submit a full application.

Submission & Review Process

If invited to submit an application, you will be invited to create an application in the **Grants Portal**.

Final Decision

While merit is evident in nearly every application received by the Trust, only a portion of the requests reviewed can result in awards.
