What We Fund

- Family Support: Programs for those suffering from the effects of domestic violence or sexual assault, services to support child welfare, programs providing for basic needs, and other human services
- **Housing & Homelessness**: Housing and related services to support those in need, with the goal of preventing homelessness and helping people achieve housing stability
- *Hunger*: Efforts to alleviate hunger, with an emphasis on distribution and rural communities
- **Youth Development**: Organizations working with underserved youth, offering mentoring, tutoring, or out-of-school time/enrichment activities
- **Education**: Birth to 12th grade educational opportunities, adult literacy, and other programs that enhance academic skills
- **Economic Opportunity**: Opportunities that help people become economically self-sufficient, such as financial literacy, asset building, or skills-building programs

The Medina Foundation funds general operating support, capital, and program grants across a **fourteen-county region** of Western Washington, as seen below.
